Minutes of Meeting November 18, 2019 at 9:30 a.m. Dean's Conference Room (3619)

Dean Kent called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. and welcomed Ms. Amber Day the new assistant marketing director.

1. Information Update:

a. Faculty/Staff Searches:

Dr. Stefurak (CINS): CINS has one open full-time, tenure track position for an Assistant Professor of Clinical Mental Health Counseling. The search committee has identified 3 candidates to proceed further with interviews. Dr. Stefurak will review and submit a recommendation to the Dean by tomorrow.

b. Raises (AK):

- Bi-weekly employees will be notified today, November 18.
- Faculty will be notified on November 25th with an official letter.
- Staff will automatically be given a 3% across the board increase.

2. Budget Cuts (AK):

Budget cuts for CEPS this year will be 1.56% = \$150,000 to be permanently removed. Academic Affairs is taking a 3.92% cut. Cuts were based on the credit hour production

from Fall 2016 – Fall 2019. CEPS was down 1,557 credit hours during that time period which totaled one million, sixty-one thousand dollars (\$1,061,000).

3. Marketing and Communication Update (AD):

Ms. Day distributed a hand out titled "CEPS Marketing and Communications Update".

- Utilizing USA brand standards in flyers, brochures, promotional materials.
- Build social media presence (Facebook and Twitter).
- Stall News small version of monthly eNewsletter to be printed and put in stalls of CEPS bathrooms.

4. Grants and Contracts Update (AG):

The internal grant competition deadline is today or tomorrow. CEPS is currently #1 within the University in the area of grants and contracts at \$11,713.509.13.
